#### Reasons Abound for School Rezoning Scenario B

As parents of P.S. 452 students, we applaud the intent to diversify District 3 elementary schools that underlies both rezoning proposals presented by the city's Department of Education ("Ideas for Rezoning Schools Unsettle Upper West Side," July 15). But we favor the more ambitious scenario B, which includes the relocation of P.S.

452 to the current site of P.S. 191 on 61st Street and Amsterdam Avenue. Scenario B would enhance low-income access to P.S. 452, resolve the school's space constraints and offer a solid opportunity to diversify and promote multicultural education in the 21st century. Being a racially and socioeconomically diverse school, it will enhance students' interracial understanding, empathy and ability to learn from people of diverse backgrounds, building a stronger community and parent engagement.

Giving our school its own space will allow the stellar group of P.S. 452 educators who now work at the school's cramped building on 77th Street to expand the curriculum with dedicated spaces for visual and performing arts, science, a library, technology and athletics. At present, due to the co-location with two other schools in a crowded building

originally designed to serve middle-school students, P.S. 452 students have limited access to common spaces such as an auditorium, gym, yard and cafeteria; specialized services for occupational, physical and speech therapy sometimes have to be provided in hallways, where distractions abound and privacy is lacking. P.S. 452 teachers along with a strong group of parents overwhelmingly support the move.

Opponents of both DOE proposals claim that rezoning does too little to diversify District 3 elementary schools. We welcome a serious consideration of controlled choice as well as a relocation of P.S. 452, which would undoubtedly go further in allowing low-income families to access high-performing schools. But we also recognize the space constraints under which P.S. 452 professionals currently labor. We endorse proposal B as an opportunity to bring a high-performing school with a cohesive team of educators to a better, dedicated facility and increase its socioeconomic diversity.


