Overall Impact of Diversity Plan

This is the third year of the districtwide diversity initiative in District 3.

While in prior years 25% of seats were prioritized for students who were lower performing and eligible for free or reduced price lunch, since there was no state test score data from spring 2020 to identify lower performing students, this year 25% of seats were prioritized for any student eligible for free or reduced price lunch.



Overall Impact of Diversity Plan

- 1,360 students received an offer to a District 3 middle school, down from 1,460 last year. This year, 1,650 rising 6th graders applied to a participating District 3 middle school, a slight decrease from ~1,730 last year. Of them,
- 65% matched to their top choice, and 90% matched to one of their top three choices, up from 58% and 86% last year.
- Fewer than 20 received an offer to a school not listed on their application. This is a decrease from ~80 students last year.

What waitlists can a student be on?

- Students were automatically added to waitlists at any programs listed higher than the school to which they got an offer. (E.g., a student who matched to their second choice was automatically added to their first choice waitlists.)
 - Families can see their position on waitlists in live time.
 - There are separate waitlists for general education students (GE) and student with disabilities.
- Families may add themselves to waitlists at any schools they are eligible for.
- There are instructions and tutorial videos on navigating waitlists in MySchools at schools.nyc.gov/middle



What Happens If You Get a Waitlist Offer

- If a school can make you a waitlist offer, they will contact you directly.
- You will have one week to accept or decline a waitlist offer.
- You can only have ONE accepted offer. If you do not accept a waitlist offer, you will keep your current offer.



Waitlist Timeline

- Waitlists will remain open through August
- After Waitlists Close
 - Students will no longer be able to join waitlists
 - Schools will no longer make waitlist offers.
