Co-President Report (Jill Rackmill)

- CEC3 represents parents in District 3 from (59th–122nd St.), covering 11,000 students across 28 schools.
- Highlights: Expansion of Mott Hall II school, Hispanic Heritage Month, National Voter Registration Day, upcoming mayoral election.
- Council updates: Two Manhattan Borough President appointees (Sequoia Bilal, Sharon Meiri Fox), awaiting D75 representative.
- CEC3 meets on the third Tuesday monthly in accessible buildings.
- Roles include hosting parent meetings, school visits, SLT attendance, capital planning, zoning approvals, public hearings, superintendent evaluations.

Superintendent's Report (Kamar Samuels) Superintendent Report

- Focus on math engagement; monthly math questions introduced.
- Math proficiency: 41% of D3 3rd graders answered a key question correctly.
- Test scores: Overall increase 5%, Math slightly decrease 1%, Science increase 8%.
- School performance highlights: Locke School (ELA +21%), Journal Truth (Math +21%), Manhattan School for Children (ELA -2.75%), Sepia 76 (Math -20%).
- District rankings: ELA 67% (3rd citywide), Math 64% (tied 5th/6th).
- Concerns: Economically disadvantaged students underperforming (ELA 42%, Math 39%).
- Federal grant (\$7.5M) discontinued; district seeking replacement funding.
- Staffing updates: New principals and assistant principals appointed.
- Working groups launched (Mid-District, Southern, Harlem).
- DCEP goals follow-up: 88% of 8th graders took Algebra 1, family survey response rates shared.

Committee Reports

- Five committees were created.
- The Middle School Committee needs a chairperson.
- New rules require at least one in-person attendee for committee meetings.

• Resolution 1: Strengthening Protections Against Exploitation of Children – Passed unanimously (9 Yes votes).
